ROUTE INTO SPORT

Aliyah started playing netball at primary school and then joined her local club. She enjoyed playing because it was an emotional release and opportunity to socialise and meet new people in a structured environment. She was selected into the Mavericks u17s squad for a national tournament and progressed through age groups before breaking into the Super League in 2019. She was also selected into England u19s squad in 2019 and progressed into England Futures Programme for 2024/25.

BIGGEST CHALLENGES

She had numerous unsuccessful England trials at age group stage and took five attempts to break into the England pathway which knocked her confidence and self-belief.

After a long struggle with depression and anxiety, she was diagnosed with AuDHD in 2022 and still suffers with bouts of severe mental health difficulties which intensified after leaving the structure and routine provided in school.
